AID FOR UKRAINE - a request from Mandy & Mike Scott

Some may remember Mandy and I went to Ukraine with a van full of aid last year – well we are doing it again this year!

We are loading the van on the 7th February, arriving at the depot in Chelm on the 10th, God willing. We desperately need first aid, medicines, bandages, surgical gloves, aprons, and anything else of that type, last year we took (among other stuff) about 200 Catheter tubes!

Along with the need for medical stuff for humans, there has been a growing problem regarding pets that have been left behind on or near the front line. As people have fled the fighting, they've not always been able to take their pets with them, so, for example, one animal rescue centre about 20 miles behind the front line currently has about 1000 dogs to look after. If dogs are allowed to roam, they'll form packs and risk spreading infection, turning rabid, or even attacking humans. So..... if you have any dog food, cat food, pet medicines or shampoo – all will be gratefully received!

I grew up in London, and I'm just old enough to remember the bomb sites, a one-legged man selling matches on the street, the care packages sent to the UK from the USA, so my heart goes out to Ukraine; thousands upon thousands of people have been bombed out and made homeless, so Mandy and I feel the need to help in some way however small that way may be.

LATEST UPDATE – THE VACANCY FOR OUR VICAR

Thank you to all who contributed to the production of the Parish Profile through the questionnaire and your responses and to the writing and editing team chaired by Robin who pulled it all together. The final document was approved by the PCCs of Tidenham, St Briavels and Hewelsfield and was submitted in December to Archdeacon Hilary representing the diocese. It was promptly and positively accepted and is now available to potential applicants. The link to the Profile on the website is:

The post of Vicar of the Parish of Tidenham and Priest in Charge of the Parishes of St Briavels and Hewelsfield will be advertised in the Church Times on 17 January for four weeks, with the closing date at the week after 7 February. The appointments panel will select a short list from the applicants, if needed, and interviews will be held on Friday 7 March at the Christian Centre, Woodcroft. In addition to our nominated interview panel members, we will be seeking volunteers to help with meeting applicants,

introducing them to the area and taking them on a tour of the five churches and other key venues in the parishes.

The interview panel will comprise Bishop Robert and Archdeacon Hilary on behalf of the diocese, three PCC members from Tidenham Parish and one each from St Briavels and Hewelsfield. Our three members were elected at the PCC meeting in December and are James Parsons, Emma Phillips and Robin Riordan. As part of that nomination and election process, each was asked to produce a short statement of why they wished to be considered for this role. The statements of the three who were elected are shown below for the information of our parishioners.

James Parsons: “I worship regularly at St Luke's where I'm also a Worship Leader and music group member. As a Reader, I occasionally preach at each church and lead Compline and Evensong at Chase. I'm an active member of a small weekly group and attend midweek Holy Communion. I believe I can represent the whole church community of Tidenham Parish and all sections of our congregations. I'm committed to dedicating the necessary time for preparation and discernment during the selection and interview process. My experience in ministry, leadership, and active participation equips me to discern the qualities needed in our new Vicar.”

Emma Phillips: “Appointing a new Vicar is very important in the life of our Parish and the outcome of the interview will impact on many people throughout the community.

Why me?

- Being a member of the panel requires commitment and enthusiasm
- Prepared to invest the time required to help find the right candidate
- Listen without bias or judgement
- Good communication skills, approachable, friendly, organised, reliable, logical, fair, team player
- Our new Vicar is for everyone, no one person is more important than any other
- Welcome the opportunity to familiarise myself with the distinct church communities and worship styles to be a good representative
- Familiarity with interview process – albeit in context of medical professionals
- Neither young nor old, some experience of life, a degree of spiritual maturity and a strong faith”

Robin Riordan “I have many years of experience of interviewing candidates for leadership roles, as a former company Senior Vice President. I also did mock interviews with the Gloucester Diocese third-year curates, so have an idea of the questions asked and what candidates are interested in. I will ensure that I listen to what parishioners and God want in our new Vicar and am intimately knowledgeable of the parish survey and vacancy profile! Although I mainly attend St Luke, I will ensure that I attend St Mary & St Peter and St Michael & All Angels, to understand the issues and candidate attributes they would like to see addressed in the interviews.

We will keep you updated, but in the meantime please contact Revd Nicki for pastoral and Churchwardens, Brian or Robin, for non-pastoral matters. And we also have a special prayer to help us with the vacancy:

Heavenly Father, during this vacancy, guard and grow the Parishes of Tidenham, St Briavels and Hewelsfield, as we serve you together in this period without a Priest in Charge.

Lord Jesus, we know you have plans for us and that these plans are good. We ask you now that You will help us to share responsibility, grow in faith, love one another, care for those in need, reach out to others, and welcome newcomers.

Holy Spirit, please guide those who are seeking the right person for us, and those who are seeking the right place for their ministry, that together we may discover Your way for the future and see Your Kingdom grow.
